Willie Autry - Was a graduate of Daphne High School in 1992. Mr. Autry played Varsity Football and scored the first touchdown at DHS. He was involved in Basketball and was on the team for the first Area Championship Team in 1992

Sarah Bonner Husey – Graduated in 1997 Ms. Husey was involved in our Yearbook, Cheerleading and Honor Society while she was here at Daphne High School.

Melissa Scorza – Melissa was in several activities while here at Daphne High School. She was in Cross Country, Track, Girls Service Club and ROTC. After graduating in 1998 She joined the National Guard as a Flight Medic

Shumbe Hunter – Shumbe was the first basketball player to start as a Varsities all four years. He was the first student to receive a Basketball Athletic Scholarship to a 4-year institution and he was voted best-dressed student in 1996. He is a graduate of the class of 1996

Mary Beth Key – Graduated in 2000 - Ms. Key ended with a GPA of 3.92. She was Daphne High Schools Female Athlete of the year in 2000. She was 6A State Tennis Finals player and #1 doubles player. She was selected for Mobile Press Register's Sweet 16 Volleyball and Elite 8 Volleyball State Championship in 2000.

Ben Mosley – Ben graduated in 1997 - One of Ben's greatest memories at Daphne High School was playing in the 1994 Baseball Championships.
