

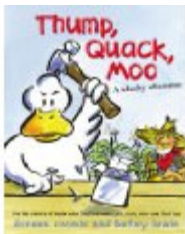
NEW BOOKS IN JBS SLINEY LIBRARY SEPT- OCT. 2008

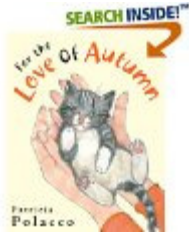
Ryan, Pam Munoz: Hello Ocean- Using rhyming text, a child describes the wonder of the ocean experience through each of her five senses. **E RYA**

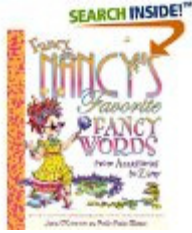
Watt, Melanie: Chester's Back- Chester, the mischievous cat is back for a sequel **.E WAT**



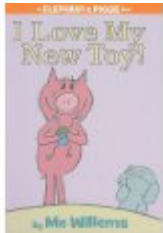
