

CRCT Time is Here! How can you better prepare?

Helpful Tips:

At home, establish a set place and time for completion of homework. Consider setting up a regular schedule for online practice.

Regular school attendance is important. If your child is absent, contact the school to obtain missing assignments.

Parent involvement is a key part of a child's success in school. Contact teachers if you have a concern, attend parent conferences when asked, and talk to your child about their day. Additionally, check your student's grades on PowerSchool and assign-

ments via the school web site.

Studies have shown that students who do not get adequate sleep have more problems with attention, memory, and concentration. According to research, school age children should receive NO LESS than 10 hours of sleep per night.

Please insure that your child is present and on time for testing each day. Children perform their best when they are able to test in their normal instructional setting. Thanks!

Signs/Symptoms:

Be concerned if:

Unusual hunger during or after school Waiting to use the bathroom at home Change in behavior or lack of concentration

School Phobia

Sleepiness, inattentiveness

Response or Resource:

Increase observation of student and symptoms

Talk with parents and teachers Spend more time with student

Start asking questions if:

Physical complaints

Unexplained injuries or bruises Unaccountable fear, crying

Bedwetting

Failing academic performance Skipping classes

Response or Resource:

Broach subject gently

Listen carefully and be patient

Believe the victim

Set up care team meeting

Reinforce school policy

Act Immediately If:

Depressive/suicidal symptoms Giving away valued possessions Self-Mutilation

Becoming aggressive and violent Writing about death and suicide Stating they would not be missed

Response or Resources:

Alert parents and medical care Offer a safe place for expressions of fears and anxieties

Be trustworthy

Don't leave them alone


