The 2010-2011 school year is off to a wonderful start. We began our first week with fifth grade and new student orientation, on Friday, August 13. Many of our new student and parents attended and were eager to learn about the school.

As a continuation of the Life Skills program which began last year at Robertsville, we held student assemblies and a community assembly the third week of school called "Rachel's Challenge". Many students and parents alike signed a banner indicating that they intend to follow through on their pledge to accept five challenges:

## Notes from the clinic


$7^{\text {th }}$ Grade immunizations-Please make sure your $7^{\text {th }}$ grader's immunizations are up to date with the new state guidelines. Most students entering $7^{\text {th }}$ grade this year will need to have a second Varicella Vaccine, and a Tdap booster. These vaccines must then be recorded on the new state immunization form, which the physician must complete and then the Certificate of Immunization is to be turned in to the RMS Clinic. The RMS immunization records will be audited by the state after October 1, 2010. PLEASE help us be up to date and complete this process before October 1!!!!

Medications---Remember that students are not to be in possession of any medications while at school. The clinic does not have stock medications that the nurse or other school personnel can distribute to the students. Any medication to be given to a student at school must be brought by the parent/guardian to the school nurse, and the appropriate paperwork must be completed. Medication forms may be downloaded from my website, or from the main OR Schools website under Pupil Services.

Emergency Contact information----PLEASE keep your contact information current. I hope I won't need to call any parents, but it is best to keep accurate information on file for emergency situations.

Lets all have a great HEALTHY year. I would love to spend more of my day promoting healthy living here at RMS. I hope to be visible to students throughout the building, encouraging more walking, encouraging more physical activity in all aspects of our day. There are certainly many things that can be done at home to encourage a healthier lifestyle for all of us. So think about where you can add a few extra steps in your day, another serving of veggies or fruits, some family activity, take a walk or play an active game together.

## RACHEL'S CHALLENGE

On Monday, August $30^{\text {th }}$, our students heard a powerful story of kindness and compassion. RMS hosted an event called Rachel's Challenge, a national organization in memory of Rachel Scott. Rachel Scott was the first victim in the tragedy at Columbine High School on April 20, 1999. When Rachel was 13 -years-old, she traced her hands on the back of her dresser and wrote, "these hands belong to Rachel Joy Scott and will someday touch millions of peoples hearts." Two weeks before she died, Rachel wrote an essay in which she wrote, "If one person will go out of their way to show a little compassion, it will start a chain reaction." During the assembly, students watched video clips of Rachel's friends and family who spoke about Rachel's legacy and her way of reaching out to others. Our students were challenged to eliminate prejudice by looking for the best in others, to set goals, to choose positive influences, to be kind to each other and to start a chain reaction. As a result of Rachel's Challenge, Robertsville is forming the Chain Links Club, a club designed to continue the momentum of Rachel's Scott's message. This club is open to any student and will focus on making RMS a more welcoming school and encouraging students to perform random acts of kindness and to show compassion towards others.

## $6^{\text {th }}$ Grade Tremont News

Sixth grade students will have the opportunity this year to attend the Great Smoky Mountains Institute at Tremont for a weekend trip in the spring.

The date for the trip is April 1-3, 2011. We will leave RMS on Friday afternoon at 3:00 p.m. and return Sunday afternoon.

The cost of the trip is $\$ 175$ and covers transportation, lodging in the Tremont dorms, delicious meals, and programs by the Tremont staff and other organizations.

Students can pay in three installments with the first deposit of $\$ 75$ due by Sept. 16. This deposit is nonrefundable. The other two payments of $\$ 50.00$ will be due the week of Nov 29 and the week of J an 10, 2011.

The students who choose to participate in this trip will be required to attend a few meetings in J anuary, February, and March. These meetings will be after school and will provide more information regarding the trip. Students must meet the field trip guidelines as described in the 2010-2011 RMS Parent and Student Handbook. If fewer than 50 students make reservations with the $\$ 75.00$ deposit, then the trip will be cancelled and deposits will be refunded.

Interested parents can be considered as chaperones, but need to let their child's science teacher know by Sept 16. The trip includes an eight-mile hike and parent chaperones will be charged $\$ 164.00$ to cover Tremont's base price.

2011 RAM yearbook will be on sale at school from October 1115, 2010 ONLY.

The cost is $\$ 25$, cash or check to RMS. Students should turn in money to the homeroom teachers. Parents may combine payments for multiple students on one check. With your payment, please clearly submit each student's name and homeroom. No extra copies will be available at the end of the year, so students must pre-pay.

Another option is to order and pay for your yearbook online! Visit www. yearbookforever.com during the whole month of October to place your order and pay by credit or debit card. A \$1 processing fee will be added to each transaction. Optional upgrades such as name stamping and plastic covers are available as add-ons ONLY through the online ordering system. Robertsville will host two authors this year. On October 7, adventure author Roland Smith will visit RMS. In December, Kimberly Angle will speak to 5th and 6th graders. Since Mr. Smith's visit is first, I will devote the library column to his book.

A former zookeeper, Roland Smith is the author of dozens of novels and non-fiction books for children and young adults. Many of those books have been featured in Scholastic book fairs and have received numerous state and national awards. Summaries of some of his books are listed below.
Peak--As the son of famous mountaineer, Peak Marcello has climbing in his genes. In this intense and action packed novel, Peak tries to become the youngest person to reach the summit of Mount Everest. While training to reach the summit, he befriends a young Nepalese boy and comes to realize some things in life are more important than records. Cryptid Hunters and Tentacles--After their parents (famous nature photographers) disappear in South America, Marty and Grace are taken care of by their eccentric uncle. What makes him so bizarre? He is obsessed with cryptozoology and travels the world searching for these legendary creatures. In Cryptid Hunters, they venture to Congo to search for a mythic dinosaur. In the sequel, they head to the South Pacific to find giant squid. Constant twists and turns and Smith's unique sense of humor make this series very popular with middle schoolers.

Elephant Run--Set in Burma during WWII, this novel features a renegade elephant named Hannibal. Having been attacked by a tiger, Hannibal can no longer be trusted to work on teak plantation. Indeed, everyone fears this giant animal as he roams the jungle. However, after the Japanese army invades Burma and captures Nick and his friend Mya must depend on Hannibal to help rescue their fathers.

IQ-Independence Hall and White Hall--In this series, Smith illustrates his talent as a mystery writer. Q and his new stepsister Angela find themselves caught in a web of International intrigue and danger as they try to solve the mystery of Angela's mother, a spy who may or may not be dead. Their searches for clues lead them into danger.... and discovery.

Roland Smith will speak to all students at RMS during his visit. The media center will be selling copies of his novels during the Book Fair. Please check the RMS web page for more details. As always, students who purchase a book will be invited to autograph party.
